## FROM YOUR PASTOR

One of my most treasured possessions—something, in addition to the pug, I'd grab as I ran out of a burning building—is an 8x10 photo taken at Jerusalem's Western Wall, better known as the Wailing Wall: the ruined remains of the ancient Temple, where Jews come to mourn its destruction, to wail. In the photo is a pudgy little boy. His wail is in altogether other key: he's clapping, dancing, and laughing.

Clapping, dancing, laughing at the Wailing Wall. Looks like, sounds like, smells and tastes like Easter.

Easter joy is more than whistling in the dark, something other than singin' in the rain. Easter joy doesn't deny heartache, sickness or sadness, danger or disappointment. (Come on already. Just look around.) A Christian doesn't deny the darkness—but we choose not to live in it.

The Christian who "gets it" is a living mystery. You know the type: they carry on, move forward, die and rise, and die and rise again, and again, in a way that wouldn't make sense, that wouldn't be possible, if a power and strength beyond their own weren't involved—if the Risen One weren't in their lives, their blood, their bones.

Easter joy testifies that, despite the fact that all is not well, God will never let us go. Nothing—no cancer, no job loss, no war, not sticks or stones, another's meanness or small-mindedness, neither the death of our most beloved, nor our own death—nothing, no thing, *NOTHING*—can separate us from God, can set us loose from Love Itself. Death is not the final word. God *always* has the last word: LIFE TO THE CRUCIFIED!

In "Manifesto," Wendell Berry writes,

*Be joyful though you have considered all the facts...  
Practice resurrection.*

Yes, indeed...practice, practice, practice. Practice resurrection.

**CTK IMMIGRATION UPDATE:** When U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents detain and subsequently deport undocumented workers, what happens to the children of those workers, many of whom were born in the U.S. and, by law, are U.S. citizens? A new report, *“Severing a Lifeline: The Neglect of Citizen Children in America’s Immigration Enforcement Policy”*, takes a detailed look at the impact of immigration law and enforcement policy upon citizen children. The study’s authors contend that immigration laws are out of step with the way children are treated in other areas of U.S. law and, at best, marginalize, and at worst, totally ignore, the children’s status as citizens.

Join us for an in-depth discussion of these issues. Are we neglecting children’s interests in the pursuit of immigration control? Which laws should apply to these children? How can our enforcement approach be changed—or should it be changed at all—to minimize harm to citizen children of undocumented parents?
