SOWERS OF JUSTICE —COME TO THE PEACE FOUNDATION'S SUMMER LAUNCH 2008 — Join northside neighbors, leaders, youth and CTKers and other congregations to support a summer of PEACE on the Northside on Thursday, April 24th from 6:30-8:30pm at the Capri Theater, 2027 W. Broadway. The event will present the 1st annual PEACE Foundation Northside Neighbor & Partner Awards and will feature the soulful music of Chastity Brown and the Sound (named one of StarTribune's 2007 Top Ten Local Artists). MAKE SURE YOUR REPRESENTATIVE OPPOSE THE SHULER-TANCREDO BILL -- This bill, the Save Act, does not solve the immigration problem in a Christian manner. Many representatives in Congress have already opposed it — John Kline, Michele Bachmann, and Jim Ramstad. Write to your representatives (you can find names and addresses of legislators by accessing their website at the Legislative Contacts tab on the Sowers website (www.ctksowers.org) and urge them to sign the “discharge petition” for the bill. The U.S. Catholic Bishops believe that, if enacted, this bill will drive undocumented immigrants and their families further underground, thus creating a hidden society of persons without full rights in their communities.

KEEP WRITING THE GOVERNOR ABOUT THE HEALTH CARE ACCESS FUND— Even if you've already written the governor and/or your legislators about not tapping into the Health Care Access Fund for low-income Minnesotans in order to balance the budget, write again — and again and again. Volume helps! Just write a simple letter along these lines — “Please don't let the governor raid the Health Care Access Fund to balance his budget” — and send it to legislators and even the governor himself. You'll find names and addresses of legislators by accessing their website at the Legislative Contacts tab on the Sowers website (www.ctksowers.org). Or you can just choose to send emails to them.

UNIQUE PLAY ABOUT IMMIGRATION — “Border Crossing” is the story of a resilient little girl who traces her immigrant parents' footsteps across the Arizona/Mexico border.
